SMSAAM (SSE; SMSAAM) reports on operating volumes for April 2022 by business division

Towage

- In April, maneuvers were down 3% with respect to 2021, mainly due to reduced calls, partly offset by a different service mix. YTD volumes were up 4% (excluding Intertug, volumes fell 1%).

Port Terminals

- At consolidated port terminals, volumes fell 7% in April and 5% YTD due to reduced calls and blank sailings because of congestion.
- Associate terminal volumes for the month remained in line with 2021. YTD there was a 4% drop due to a high basis of comparison mainly at Chilean ports.

- Bonded Warehouses: Climbed 8% in April and 20% YTD due to import growth and port congestion.
- Aerosan⁽³⁾: Tons handled up 5% for the month and YTD mainly because of increased cargo in Colombia.
