



# SAAM – Operational Data 2023

SMSAAM (SSE; SMSAAM) reports on operating volumes for April 2023 by business division

## Towage

- Harbour towage maneuvers were up 13% in April with respect to the same month in 2022 and 12% YTD mainly due to increased activity in almost all markets, the reactivation of the cruise season, new service contracts and growing operations in Peru.
- Time charter days, associated with services at oil, gas and mining terminals, decreased by 5% in April with respect to the previous year and grew 4% YTD.

## Port Terminals

- In April, consolidated terminals saw a 9% rise in throughput for the month (10% YTD), mostly because of growth in Bolivian imports and increased activity at North and Central American terminals.
- In April, associate terminals recorded the smallest drop in volume of the year (8%), reflecting an improvement in throughput. YTD volumes at associate terminals fell 24% mainly explained by a decline in import volumes in Chile, mostly from Asian trades, and a high basis of comparison in 2022.

## Logistics

- Bonded warehouses reported a 41% drop during the month and 48% YTD due to a high basis of comparison from the prior year because of increased warehousing by customers due to high inventory levels throughout the entire first half of 2022.
- Aerosan<sup>(2)</sup>: tons mobilized during the month of April decreased by 8% versus last year due to a drop in imports because of cancellations of cargo flights. Similarly, the YTD 8% drop also reflects the lower imports in Chile and Colombia.
