SMSAAM (SSE; SMSAAM) reports on operating volumes for January 2026 by business division

Towage

- In January 2026, port towage operations increased by 5% over January 2025. This growth is explained by the addition of new customers in 2025, increased activity in Canada and the award of a new contract in El Salvador. These effects were partially offset by the termination of the operation in Honduras in 1Q2025.
- Time charter days—mostly associated with dedicated towage services at oil, gas and mining terminals—grew by 1%, largely as a result of new contracts in El Salvador and Uruguay.
- The number of tugboats for the month increased by 2 over January 2025, reflecting the acquisition of vessels for the Chilean and Peruvian operations.

Aerosan

- Export tons increased by 1% compared to January 2025, driven mainly by higher salmon exports from Chile, which partially offset lower movement in other markets.
- Import volumes were down 22% compared to January 2025, mainly due to lower market dynamism and the seasonal nature of some customers' activity.
