SMSAAM (SSE; SMSAAM) reports on operating volumes for February 2026 by business division

Towage

- Harbour towage operations in February 2026 were up 8% over the same period in 2025. This growth is explained by increased oil terminal activity in Brazil and a new liner customer added there in 3Q25, together with a new contract awarded at the Port of Acajutla in El Salvador, partially offset by the termination of operations in Honduras in 1Q25.
- Time charter days—associated mainly with dedicated towage services at oil, gas and mining terminals—were up 5% because of new contracts in El Salvador and Uruguay.
- The fleet size increased by 2 units with respect to February 2025 because of new vessels added in 2025.

Aerosan

- Exports (metric tons) climbed 5% compared to February 2025, driven primarily by greater salmon export volumes in Chile, which partially offset downturns in other markets.
- Imports (metric tons) fell 17% compared to February 2025, explained mainly by a seasonal slowdown in some markets and a temporary drop in activity from some customers.
