SMSAAM (SSE; SMSAAM) reports on operating volumes for May 2026 by business division

Towage

- Port towing operations increased by 11% compared to May 2025. This was driven by increased activity at oil terminals in Brazil, the addition of a new liner customer in that country and increased activity in Panama related to the Canal. Year-to-date, volumes have increased by 8% due to new contracts in Brazil, Canada and El Salvador.
- Time charter days -mostly associated with dedicated towage services at oil, gas and mining terminals- increased by 3% compared to May 2025. This was related mostly to new contracts in Acajutla, El Salvador. Year-to-date, they have recorded a 1% increase. This growth was driven by new contracts in El Salvador and Uruguay and was partially offset by the discontinuation of operations in Honduras.
- The number of tugboats in operation increased by two compared to May 2025 due to the addition of new vessels in Chile during the last quarter of 2025 and a new tugboat in Peru in March of this year.

Aerosan

- Export volumes rose 2% compared to May 2025. The growth was driven by increased salmon shipments from Chile. Year-to-date, they have recorded a 4% increase driven by new contracts in Chile and Ecuador. This growth was partially offset by lower activity in Colombia.
- Import volumes fell by 9% compared to May 2025 mainly due to lower activity in Colombia, which was affected by flight cancellations resulting from the conflict in the Middle East. So far this year, the cumulative volume of imports has fallen by 14%, with the decline concentrated in Colombia and Chile.
