



SAAM – Operational Data 2026

Santiago, August 19, 2026

SMSAAM (SSE; SMSAAM) reports on operating volumes for July 2026 by business division.

Towage

- Harbour towage operations increased by 6% compared to July 2025. This growth is attributable to greater dynamism in Brazil, new contracts added in Peru and El Salvador and increased activity in Canada’s bulk cargo and oil sectors. These factors were partially offset by lower activity in Chile, due to port closures caused by weather conditions. On a year-to-date basis, volumes grew by 8%, driven primarily by the start of operations under new contracts in Brazil, Peru, Canada and El Salvador.
- Time charter days—associated mainly with dedicated towage services at oil, gas and mining terminals—reported no variation from last year's figure.
- The number of tugs in operation increased by three compared to July 2025, reaching 204 at the end of July 2026. This increase is due to new units added in Peru, Mexico and Chile.

Aerosan

- Export volumes climbed 6% compared to July 2025, due primarily to increased salmon exports in Chile and greater activity in Ecuador. Year to date, growth stands at 4%, driven by performance in Chile and Ecuador, partially offset by lower volumes in Colombia.
- Import volumes fell by 7% compared to July 2025, influenced primarily by lower volumes in Colombia. Year to date, volumes show a 12% decline, mainly explained by weaker performances in both markets.
